PUBLIC ART BIKE TRAIL IN NORTHERN BRIMBANK

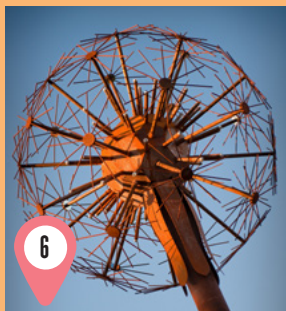
Approx 26 km circuit

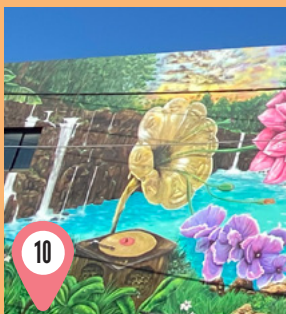


SEEDS OF HOPE AND DREAMS

The centrepiece of this multi-locational work is the large Yam Daisy, which is a symbol of hope and dreams.



FLOWERS IN A MINOR

This mural takes inspiration from music, represents different cultures and embraces the protection of our bio and cultural diversity

A series of 24 Golden Sun Moths, considered endangered species in Victoria, were made with coloured optical material to reflect coloured light.

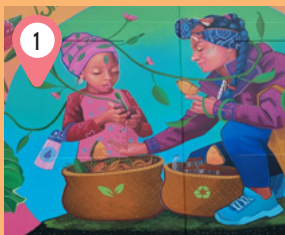
