



The theatre is named after the late artist, Leigh Bowery who grew up in Brimbank. Leigh Bowery was one of the most influential international arts figures of the 80s and 90s. This year the Bowery Theatre celebrates five years since its opening and pays homage to Leigh's legacy.

Braille and tactile signage located throughout the centre includes ground floor and level 1.


