The Yellow Line is a gripping new work inspired by true events at Port Phillip Prison, which is set to close in 2025 amid major prison reforms. A Pasifika guard is tasked with teaching haka to inmates, uncovering deep truths about identity, justice, and redemption. But can culture and connection break the cycle of incarceration?

Essence Theatre Productions, under Artistic Director Alaine Beek and Ngā Mātai Pūrua (NMP), nurturing Māori cultural identity through Kapa Haka, language, and advocacy have united to create *The Yellow Line*.

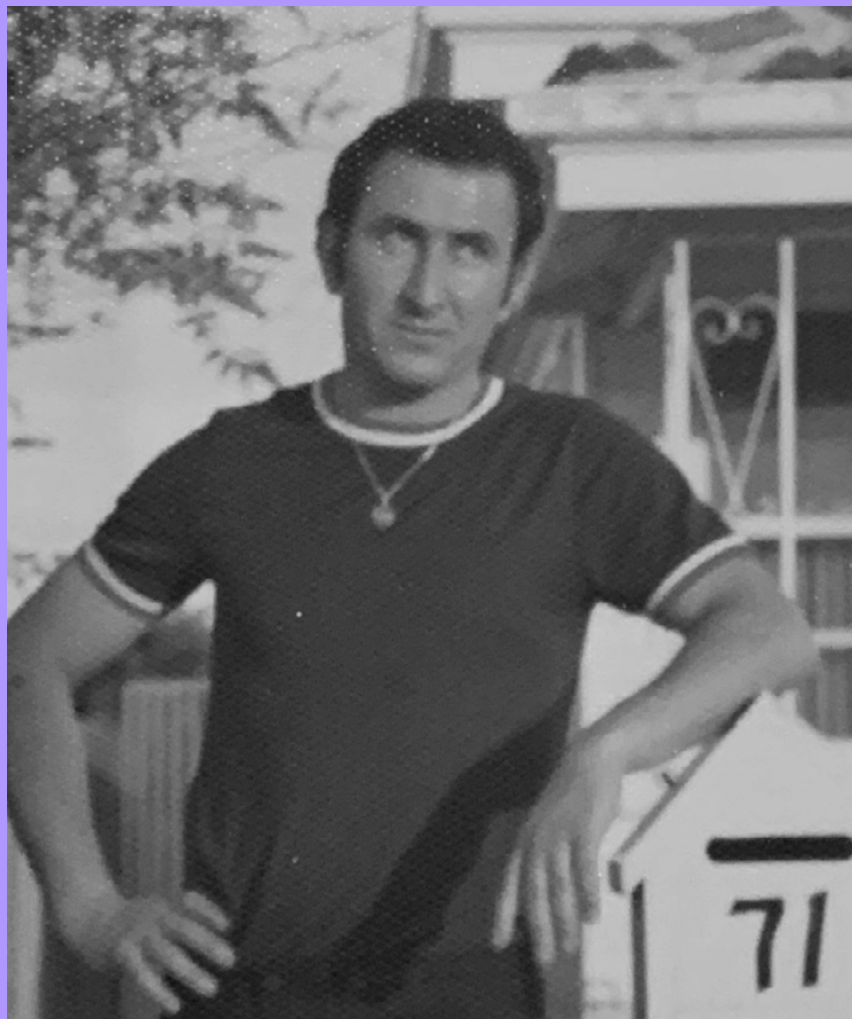

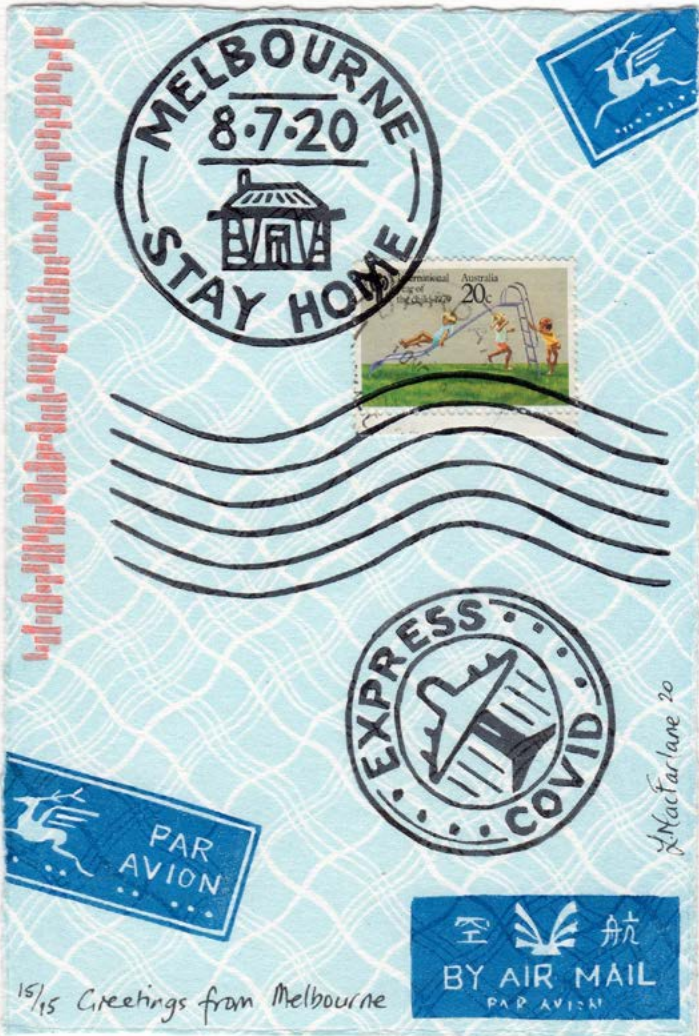

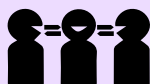
